Context

This breakout session provides EUPAN members with a forum to discuss European values and progress in the application of artificial intelligence in public administration. Under the guidance of our facilitators, participants will propose and discuss their own questions about AI and policy making with colleagues from across Europe.

The breakout session aims to be as interactive as possible, therefore, participants will first be assigned a group with a pre-assigned sub-theme. The participants will then formulate questions in their groups within their assigned theme. The pre-determined themes are *climate considerations*, *legal competencies*, and *technical challenges* associated with implementing AI in the public sector.

The session is meant to offer a chance to share knowledge with other EUPAN members in a non-formal setting and therefore there are no expectations regarding participants' prior knowledge of AI.

Each participant will first create questions within a single, designated sub-theme and later discuss questions with other sub-themes developed by other groups. Participants might want to reflect on the below-listed questions before attending the breakout session:





Questions for reflections

- 1. In your country, are Al innovation incentives tied to sustainability requirements, or do these two policy areas still run on separate tracks?
- 2. In your country, to what extent are AI tools already used in drafting laws, regulations, or court workflows? What implications does it have for the public legal-affairs workforce to use AI in their work?
- 3. What strategies is your government pursuing to build digital skills and AI literacy in the public sector workforce?
